## What do you currently do?

I most recently was the Music and Choral Director and Coordinator for a Parish in Rochester, Minnesota. I was in charge of all the musical aspects of the liturgy as well as the other liturgical aspects. In addition to planning music, scheduling rehearsals, cantor training etc. I was also responsible for the training and formation of lectors, Eucharistic ministers and I worked very closely with both priests of the Parish in planning this. However, as of May 2020, I decided to move back to Ireland to get married. I am open to many different opportunities either at the Diocesan level, a school, or even another area of Church life. I think St Patrick's College has really prepared me for this.

How do you think a degree from SPCM prepared you for today's modern world?

For me, Globalisation is a buzz word out there, especially in universities in the United States. It's the idea that you have to go away and you have to experience more of the world. I would say in the last twenty years with the rise of social media and the rise of technology the world has gotten smaller. We have access to the world in ways we didn't
